Overview:

By the 1930s, the idea of herd immunity was considered as a way to handle influenza, polio, smallpox and typhoid, among other diseases, but thinking began to shift in the 1950s when vaccines became available. It was the belief that when a sufficient number of individuals in a population are immune to a disease, as would occur if a large proportion of a population were vaccinated, herd immunity is achieved. Herd immunity acts by breaking the transmission of infection or by lessening the chances of susceptible individuals coming in contact with a person who is infectious. Herd immunity has played an important role in the successful eradication of smallpox, and it is vital in preventing the spread of diseases such as polio and measles. Join us in a discussion of the history and benefits of vaccines and herd immunity.

Physicians, nurses and advanced practice nurses.
